# **WE WORK HARD TO MEET YOUR NEEDS**

We provide need-based aid for your unique financial circumstances and partner with you to explore a combination of federal, state and SMUfunded awards, including grants, loans and work-study options.

Submit two forms by your chosen application deadline: November 1 for Early Decision I and Early Action or January 15 for Early Decision II and Regular Decision. These are the priority deadlines. Both forms will be available October 1, 2019. The FAFSA is required to determine your eligibility for federal and state need-based aid. The CSS PROFILETM is required to qualify for SMU funded needbased aid. However, SMU requires neither for awarding academic scholarships.

# 1. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for federal and state aid

For U.S. and dual citizens and permanent residents to be eligible for federal and state sources of aid, submit the FAFSA each year.

- Visit fafsa.ed.gov to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Use SMU school code 003613.
- Take advantage of the IRS Data Retrieval Tool for an easier way to provide accurate tax information on your FAFSA.
- Visit fsaid.ed.gov if you do not have a Federal Student Aid ID and would like to create one. Your FSA ID will be your electronic signature.

## 2. CSS PROFILETM for institutional aid

For SMU opportunity scholarships, shown in the sample aid packages below, you must submit a CSS PROFILETM financial aid application each year. This will give our financial aid advisors more information to further assess your financial need.

File your CSS/PROFILETM at cssprofile.collegeboard.org. Use SMU school code 6660.



# HOW DO I APPLY FOR ACADEMIC AWARDS AND WHEN WILL I BE NOTIFIED?

Our academic awards reward hard work. If you apply by your chosen application deadline – November 1 for Early Decision I and Early Action or January 15 for Early Decision II and Regular Decision – you will be automatically considered for SMU academic awards. If you applied by November 1, you will be notified in early January. If you applied by January 15, you will be notified by mid-March.

# HOW DO I APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID AND WHEN WILL I BE NOTIFIED?

The priority deadline to apply for financial aid corresponds with your chosen application deadline: November 1 for Early Decision I and Early Action or January 15 for Early Decision II and Regular Decision. You must file the FAFSA (for federal need-based consideration) and the CSS PROFILE<sup>TM</sup> (for SMU Opportunity Award) by these priority deadlines. If you applied by November 1, you will be notified in early January. If you applied by January 15, you will be notified by mid-March.

## WHAT KIND OF FINANCIAL AID IS AVAILABLE?

SMU offers academic scholarships, grants, loans and work-study awards.

# HOW DOES SMU DETERMINE THE AMOUNT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE?

FAFSA and CSS PROFILE<sup>TM</sup> information is sent to SMU, which compares the cost of attending SMU with the Expected Family Contribution (EFC)\* for the student's college education.

# WILL I HAVE A FINANCIAL AID ADVISOR AT SMU?

SMU assigns a financial aid advisor to all students.
