Working against conventions that center the nineteenth century in the Paris of Manet, and Morisot, this seminar takes a global approach to the history of nineteenth-century art. Emphasizing dynamics of cross-cultural contact and conflict, we will explore the ways in which common themes of nineteenthcentury art history (among them the idea of the heroic genius, the rise of nationalism, the birth of modernity, the influence of technology) take on a new guise in a global context. We will also tackle the problem of global history itself, with readings that not only expand the geographic focus of nineteenthcentury art history, but also consider the risks and rewards inherent in theorizing a global history of art.
