Anthony Graham Biographical Sketch



Dr. Anthony Graham is a tenured full Professor and dean of the College of Education at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University. Graham attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in English in 1997, and he attained his Master of Education degree in Secondary English Education in 1999 and his Doctorate of Philosophy in Curriculum and Teaching with a cognate in Multicultural Education in 2003, both of which are from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Prior to his work at North Carolina A&T State University, Graham was a high school English teacher. During his tenure as a professor at North Carolina A&T, Graham has published a

variety of book chapters, peer-reviewed journal articles, and co-authored a book. Additionally, he has been awarded several grants totaling approximately \$10 million, including awards from the National Science Foundation and the United States Department of Education. Graham also served as the Managing Editor of the historic peer-review academic journal *The Negro Educational Review*. Graham was recognized by the Association of North Carolina Alphamen as the 2016 Outstanding Alumni Brother of the Year for the state of North Carolina for his community engagement efforts with youth. In 2014, he was recognized by the Piedmont Triad's Business Journal magazine as a "2014 40 Leaders Under the Age of 40" Award recipient, and he received the "2014 Sarah Herbin Award" from the Black Child Development Institute-Greensboro.
